


Accessibility in WCM (formerly Schoolwires)



Inclusive Content


Thinking inclusively means revisiting content and ensuring it's set up for universal consumption. It also means choosing not to use content that doesn't meet expectations.



Quick Checklist: The Content

Evaluate all content for the following elements:

- ☐ Images have alternative text
- No images of text or blinking images and animations
- ☐ Word and PowerPoint documents are properly structured
- PDFs are tagged for accessibility
- Videos are captioned
- Instructions are clear and succinct
- ☐ Color choices have proper contrast
- ☐ Tables are not used for layout



Include accessibility tags when saved to PDF.
